Established in the mid-seventies by Raymond Burr of Perry Mason fame, there are large numbers of different orchids and tropical plants including many that provide fruit on the farm. We travel to visit a Fijian village, where we will enjoy a village welcome ceremony and see the village green and church. We drive through Lautoka the second most developed city after the capital, Suva. We see a Mosque and a Sikh temple.

DAY 16 Saturday 18 February, 2012

Auckland is the largest city and commercial centre of New Zealand. Our morning city tour takes in the main sights of Auckland, including the Harbour Bridge, which spans the beautiful Waitemata Harbour, Mount Eden, where we get a panoramic view of the city, the Auckland Museum and the quaint and stylish shopping area of Parnell. Be up on deck as we sail out of the gorgeous Auckland harbour.

DAY 19 Tuesday 21 February, 2012

Napier

Today we visit the city of Napier and have a city tour, during which our local guide will provide in-depth information about the Art Deco-style architecture of the city. We will see the National Tobacco building and many shops and houses designed in this popular 1930s style. In February 1931, an earthquake registering 7.9 on the Richter scale leveled almost all the buildings of Napier and raised the sea bed by two and a half meters.



DAY 20 Wednesday 22 February, 2012

Wellington

Today we will have a sightseeing tour of the main sights of Wellington, including the houses of parliament known as "the Beehive". We visit Mount Victoria, where we have 360 degree views of the city, then travel by cable car to the Botanical Gardens. The roses in the gardens will have an abundance of flowers.

We move on to the Fitzroy and Treasury Gardens, where we see Captain Cook's Cottage. The afternoon will be free to enjoy Melbourne's many art galleries, shops, museums and gardens.

DAY 25 Monday 27 February, 2012

We call into Rabaul today. Captured by the Japanese in 1942 during World War II, it became headquarters for the area because of its wonderful harbour. The town was destroyed in 1994 by ash from an eruption of Mt Tavorur. During our morning sightseeing tour we will drive around spectacular Simpson Harbour and around the Gazelle Peninsula enjoying the extra terrestrial look of the landscape, which is still covered in ash.

DAY 7 Tuesday 13 March, 2012

Osaka

This morning we dock in Osaka and travel to Kyoto. Established in 794AD Kyoto has remained the centre of civilisation in Japan for over a thousand years and retains its unique position as the country's historical and cultural centre. We have a panoramic tour of Kyoto and visit the Imperial Palace, completed in 1855 and home of the Imperial household from 1855 until the Meiji Restoration, when they moved to Tokyo. There is an attractive garden surrounding the Palace. We travel on to visit the Kinkankuji Temple, also known as the temple of the Golden Pavilion. It was built in the late 14th century with three stories topped with gold leaf. It extends over a pond, which reflects the building and is surrounded by beautiful landscaped gardens.

DAY 13 Monday 19 March, 2012

At sea

DAY 14 Tuesday 20 March, 2012

Hiroshima

This morning we dock in Hiroshima. We have a morning sightseeing tour and see the A-bomb Dome, across the road from the Peace Memorial Park. We visit the very moving Peace Memorial Park, home to a museum containing photographs of the atomic bomb attack. The cenotaph contains the names of all the known victims of the bomb. The cenotaph frames the Flame of Peace which will only be extinguished once the last nuclear weapon on earth has been destroyed.

DAY 15 Wednesday 21 March, 2012

Nagasaki

Today we arrive into the city of Nagasaki. Best known as the site of the second nuclear attack on Japan during WWII, we have a sightseeing tour of the city. We see the Peace Memorial Park, located near Ground Zero, the centre of the blast, which is home to a beautiful memorial fountain and the 30-foot-high Statue of Peace. We will also see other parts of the city that was for 200 years Japan's port to the outside world. This afternoon we will walk the group to the nearby Glover Gardens and see early European settlers houses surrounded by attractive gardens. Group members can explore at their own pace.

DAY 16 Thursday 22 March, 2012

At sea

DAY 17 Friday 23 March, 2012

Shanghai

Today we have a full day visiting the exciting city of Shanghai. Situated on the banks of the Hangpu River, Shanghai is the China's largest and most dynamic city with a population of more than 13 million. We will have a sightseeing tour visiting the Old City where we see alleys, markets and temples and Yu Gardens, Shanghai's finest traditional garden. Walls separate the garden into courts with different sizes and characteristics. The most picturesque section is the lotus pond and the miniature mountain. We stroll along the famous Bund flanked on one side by the Hangpu River and on the other side by the hotels, banks and clubs that are the grandiose symbols of western commercial power. We have time for shopping in this wonderful city.

DAY 18 Saturday 24 March, 2012

A final day at sea to enjoy the facilities of the ship and for any last minute shopping you may like to do. This evening we have a final night dinner to celebrate our fantastic cruise.

DAY 19 Sunday 25 March, 2012

Hong Kong

We will also visit Aberdeen Harbour and sail on a traditional junk to explore the harbour. There will be time during the day for shopping.

General Information and Booking Conditions
